BALLET MIME & CHARACTER DANCES

Important for acceptance at major ballet schools and companies.

Mime in The Petipa repertoire; Swan Lake, The Sleeping Beauty, The Nutcracker, and other 19th Century masterpieces: Coppelia, Napoli, Don Quixote, La Bayadere, Raymonda (etc.)

CLASSICAL MIME AND EXPRESSION

Dancers and the Audience may wonder where the Art of Pantomime and its coded gestures originated. In the 15th Century in Italy the Commedia dell'Arte, a musical theatrical presentation, related comical incidents between Harlequin and Columbine, (usually performed with masks). This set the basis for the formal pantomime (sign language) that developed in the Royal Court of the French Kings and later used in evening long Ballet performances; the foundation of our classical repertoire today.

CHARACTER DANCES

Character dance is a specific subdivision of classical dance. It is the stylized representation of a traditional folk or national dance, mostly from European countries, and uses movements and music which have been adapted for the theater.
